The workshop is fully funded and will cover:

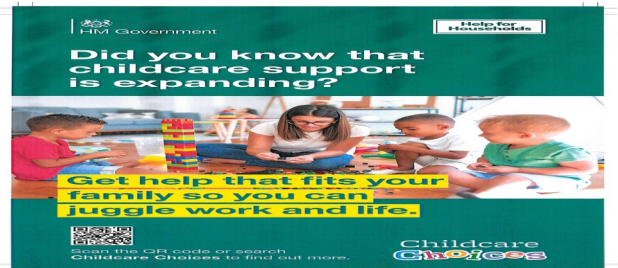
- What online harm is and online gang recruitment.

During the trip to the Walsall New Art Gallery, Year 6 had a tour of the contemporary art exhibitions over two floors in the gallery. One floor show cased a collaboration between two artists, Sophia-Layla Afsar, an artist based in Karachi, Pakistan, and Alex Billingham, an artist based in the West Midlands. Their work featured an interesting combination of hands and eyes. They then had a guided tour of the sculpture exhibition based on the work of the famous sculptor, Jacob Epstein. They got a quick go at making their own portrait head sculpture. The main event was working with a resident artist at the gallery in his workshop. The children had a workshop based on wire sculpture. They learnt tips and techniques and all enjoyed making a 3D wire sculpture – a tricky but rewarding art technique.
